SHARP Updates	<p>Dave Bonauto, bone235@Lni.wa.gov and Mike Foley, folm235@Lni.wa.gov summarized information about the handouts provided at today's meeting.</p> <p>Mike presented a PowerPoint presentation (handout also provided) on The Impact of Regulatory Enforcement and Consultation Visits on Compensable Claims Incidence Rates, 2012-2013. Mike reviewed the criteria used, data collected, and conclusions about this SHARP study. Two new research documents are available on their website entitled <i>Heat-Related Illness in Agriculture and Forestry</i> and <i>Respiratory Disease from Hop Plant Dust</i>.</p> <p>Handouts for two Fatality Narratives were provided, Tractor Operator Crushed by Trailer and Carpenter Falls from Ladder, each describing the circumstances of the fatalities, WAC requirements and recommendations for preventing similar events from occurring.</p> <p>A Hazard Alert, Preventing Injuries to Retail Workers: How to protect retail workers from being struck by motor vehicles, describing two different cases where retail workers were severely injured when they were struck by motor vehicles.</p> <p>Other handouts related to the trucking injury reduction emphasis (TIRES) provided were: Hand over your keys; Take time to review your APP; How to develop an effective safety committee; How to become a model for worksite safety and health; and Rogue driver turns safety director</p>
