MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR APPRENTICESHIP:

- Must be 18 years of age
- High School Graduate
(G.E.D. Acceptable with a minimum of 2500 points Or High School Equivalency exam with 600 or above)
- Must have completed one year of high school Algebra or equivalent post high school algebra course(s) with a passing grade of "C" or better, Or certificate of completion from the online NJATC tech math course with a passing grade at www.njatc.utk.edu
- Have a qualifying score of "5" or higher on the electrical trade's aptitude test for Inside Program, "4" for Low Energy.
- One (1) year resident of Geographical area covered by our standards (Eastern Washington-Northern Idaho) prior to making application
- Must possess a valid Driver License and have reliable transportation to get to and from job sites anywhere within Northeastern WA or Northern ID
- Must pass drug test before being accepted

AVAILABILITY OF APPRENTICESHIP OPPORTUNITIES:

The number of new apprentices to be accepted will be based upon the need of the industry as projected from reliable trends. Interviews are held on dates and times noted by the committee. If accepted into the apprenticeship program you may be required to submit evidence of physically being able to perform specific job functions, and will be required to under-go drug screening.
