
THE PROCESS

- Request an application packet & pay the
\$40 application fee
- Complete an application file with all the
required documentation/information
within 30 days of the application date
- Take the NJATC Aptitude Test, which
will be scheduled by the Training Center
office and receive a "qualifying" score
- Attend an interview which will be
conducted by the Joint Apprenticeship
Training Committee (JATC)
- Receive an eligibility score upon
completion of the interview & be placed
on the eligibility list. You will remain on
this list for a period of two years.



Minimum Qualifications

Age: Minimum of 18 years of age

Education: (must have one of the following)

- High school graduate
- HSE - minimum score of 600
- GED - minimum score of 25/2500
- Associate's Degree (or higher)

Math: Complete (1) year of high school algebra, Integrated Math II or equivalent post-high school algebra course(s) with a 'C' grade or better or equivalent math placement scores / Tech Math Certificate

Physical: Must be capable of performing the work of the electrical construction trade

Testing: Receive a qualifying score on the electrical trade's NJATC Aptitude Test, developed and validated by the American Institute for Research.

Other: (provide the following)

Valid Driver's License

Birth Certificate

DD214 papers (if applicable)


